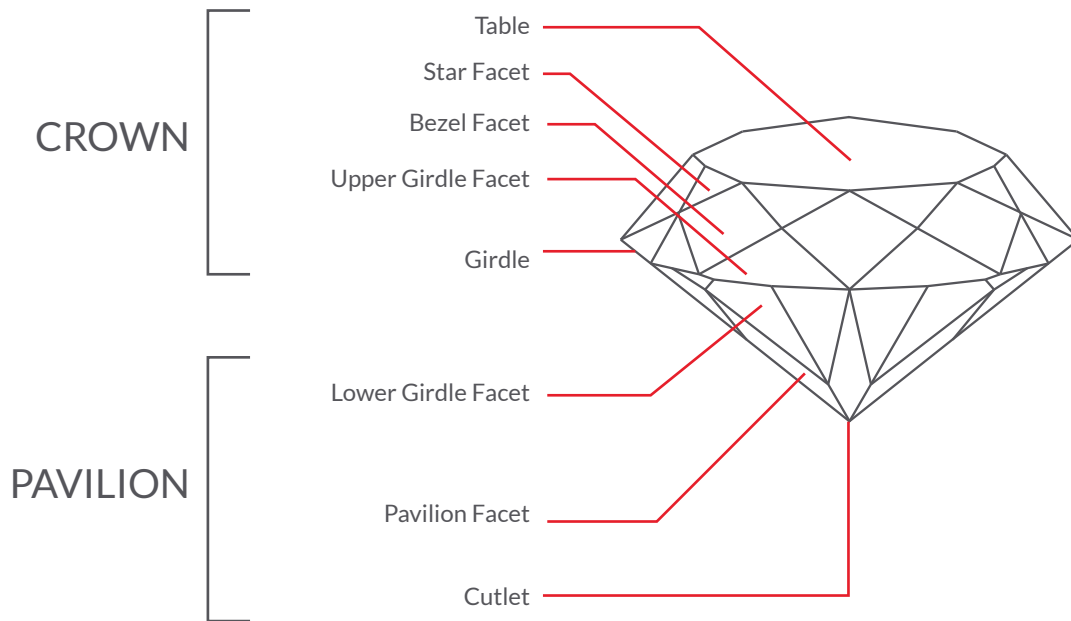

ANATOMY OF A DIAMOND

THE DIAMOND STRUCTURE

The diagram below explains the major parts of a diamond which is made up of two key sections, the Crown and Pavilion. The three most important factors to consider when determining the biggest impact on a diamond's sparkle are the diameter, table and depth.



Diameter: The width of the diamond as measured at the widest point of the girdle

Table: The largest facet at the top of the diamond

Crown: The top section of the diamond which extends between the girdle and the table.

Girdle: The diamond's widest part, between the crown and pavilion.

Pavilion: The bottom section of the diamond, between girdle and cutlet.

Cutlet: The facet at the very bottom tip of the diamond, ideally not visible to the naked eye.

Depth: The height of the diamond measured from the table to the cutlet.
